1. Spec Section 074570 – Cementitious Panels – This section is for exterior cement board siding not for cement board under ceramic tile. I can't find where this would go on the plans but did see that you want cement board under the ceramic tile. Should this section be deleted?

Response: Per Drawing -A177 Note 1, "Install 5-1/2" Metal Studs to the CMU wall at 16" on center, 5/8" thick Hardie Backerboards.......

Note: This is for Interior Use for use on the walls of the areas identified in the drawing. Since Hardie does not make 5/8", use 7/16" Hardie Backerboards mounted to the 5-1/2" metal studs. Hardie Backer cannot be supported with a lesser thickness than 20 gauge metal studs.

2. What is the length of the plank that is required and what will it be supported on? Please provide details on this scope.

Response: Drawing –A177 Note states, "Install new non-slip steel planks over the ceiling supported by the existing concrete walls. Approx. 75 linear feet. Field verify and coordinate with the Hangers and other ceiling items of the new GWB ceiling. Submittal required. See Specifications. Specification Section 055300 provides more information.

3. Please clarify what flooring will need to be replaced. There is a flooring spec, but the bathroom will be ceramic tile, correct? Where is the VCT located?

Response: On Drawing -A177 it states:

Note 23 – "In Mens and Womens Restroom install floor tile Daltite, P686, $12" \times 24"$. Field to be running board pattern. Grout to be dark color. Match color in existing restroom 1024. Submittal required for approval. Note 24 – "In Janitor's Room install new vinyl tile. – VCT with 4" cove base.

4. Please confirm that on the lighting Fixture Schedule the A and C fixtures have been reversed.

Response: Yes, A and C are reversed.

5. All the walls are existing block. All conduit and boxes will be surface mounted?

Response: Conduits and J-Box for the Handicap Door Opener will need to be surface-mounted as shown on the CMU wall.

6. Can we do our own acceptance testing?

Response: The acceptance testing will be a joint effort between the contractor and the FAA. Acceptance testing must be approved by the FAA and in particular the ZOA

facility. If you are asking pertaining to ACM there will be an independent IH contractor hired by the FAA to verify clearances.

7. Not sure if because federal but the stall layouts do not meet CA ADA legal. ADA stall is not deep enough to swing door in. You would need 56" + 34" + thickness of material to swing the door in with a wall-mounted toilet, and 3" more than that if floor mounted toilet – for stall depth. You could swing the door out normally, but you wouldn't have the clearances needed for that either. Room is too small and trying to get too many fixtures in there. Architect should be able to lay it out with some changes...

Response: Because this is a federal facility, we are bound by the American Barriers Act and the ADA, as specified in the contract. The American Barriers Act states that the design complies with the project design. Detailed in the following figures:




Figure 604.8.1.1

8. The stalls are called out to be ceiling hung. There is nothing to hang them on is it ok to use floor mounted?

Response: Floor mounting of the stalls is acceptable.

9. Specs mention custom color on the partitions possibly. There are only a couple of stalls which will increase the price significantly. Can we do standard colors?

Response: Standard colors are acceptable, but must be approved by the facility as a submittal.

10. Shelves mentioned for under the mirrors/over the sinks – normally not able to be mounted there and have the sink still operable with ADA codes being met.

Response: This has been done before with ABA/ADA codes being met. Submittal required showing exact placement and clearances. Per existing layout the shelf is mounted to the bottom of the mirrors. Check your photos.
